### Message from Dan Hannaway, Leadership Council Coordinator



*Dear Friends of the Force,*

At the end April I attended a meeting of the presidents of the seven Friendship Force clubs in the Rocky Mountain Region. There are four clubs in Colorado. In addition to ours there is Northern Colorado (Fort Collins, Loveland, Greeley area), Denver, and Western Colorado (Grand Junction area). The other three are Cheyenne, WY; Utah (Salt Lake area); and

Albuquerque, NM. The Albuquerque club was a member of the Texas Region for many years before joining the Rocky Mountain Region last year. The most notable outcome of the meeting was the announcement that the Friendship Force World Conference will be held in Boulder, CO July 23-27 next year. Delegates from around the world will be housed in dormitories on the CU campus, and meals will be available in the student cafeterias, all at very affordable rates. There will be pre- and post-conference 2/3-night homestays offered by all the clubs in our region. The conference is currently in the very early planning stages, so details are not now available.

During the first week of May I participated in the first “Super Regional Conference” hosted by the Sacramento California Club. Clubs from the Pacific North West, West Coast, Rocky Mountain, and Western Canada Regions participated. The Friendship Force family now includes a new member, Ketchikan, Alaska. The concept of a Super Regional Conference replaces the regional conferences that were limited to a single region. In the conference tradition, the 113 delegates shared ideas and stories, attended various workshops, and enjoyed each-others’ company, making new friends, and planning for the future. One of the great advantages of these conferences is providing a framework to establish a relationship with other clubs for future reciprocal journeys. We’ll see if I was successful!

## *Message from Dan (cont.)*

Another item of great interest that came from the Conference was the announcement and explanation of the structural changes at FFI in Atlanta. There is no longer a physical headquarters office in Atlanta. The expense of maintaining physical office space became prohibitive, so now virtually all the administrative duties and responsibilities are conducted by telecommuting, using laptops, computers, phones, etc. This will continue for the immediate future, but FFI hopes to establish a permanent home. Currently there are 18 staff members of FFI, half of whom are part time and live in various locations throughout the U.S. and abroad. For example, the Regional Support Managers for Brazil, Australia and New Zealand, Germany and most of Europe, Japan and some countries in Asia, the UK and Africa all live abroad.

I hope to see many of you at our next General Membership Meeting on June 19 at Silver Key, and I can answer any questions you might have.

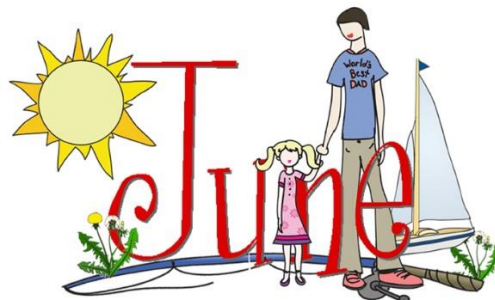
## *June General Membership Meeting*

### **WESTERN SUPER REGIONAL CONFERENCE – SACRAMENTO/ELK GROVE, CALIFORNIA**

In May, I had the pleasure of attending the first Western Super-Regional Conference hosted by the Sacramento California Friendship Force club. The conference was attended by 122 members from clubs from the Pacific Northwest, Rocky Mountain, West Coast and Western Canada Regions including clubs in: Alaska, Alberta, Arizona, California, Colorado, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, Oregon, Utah, Washington, and Wyoming.

The conference was kicked off with a “Welcome” from Steve Ly, Mayor of Elk Grove. The keynote speaker was Joy Justus, Outreach Manager, of World Relief Sacramento. She has been working with refugees through World Relief since 2012. Her presentation included a panel of refugees who gave firsthand accounts of their story. It was interesting and very “heartfelt”.

The conference included workshops on travel insurance, domestic journeys, leadership, recruitment, global journeys, using google docs, and sharing club photography worldwide. There was plenty of time to socialize, take morning walks, enjoy meals together and a fun Cinco De Mayo Gala Dinner! Sacramento FF Club did a wonderful job planning and hosting. I ended my travels with a Mystery Mini Journey in Sacramento.

### **2019 WORLD CONFERENCE IN BOULDER, COLORADO**

Oh, Summer, remain forever here!*

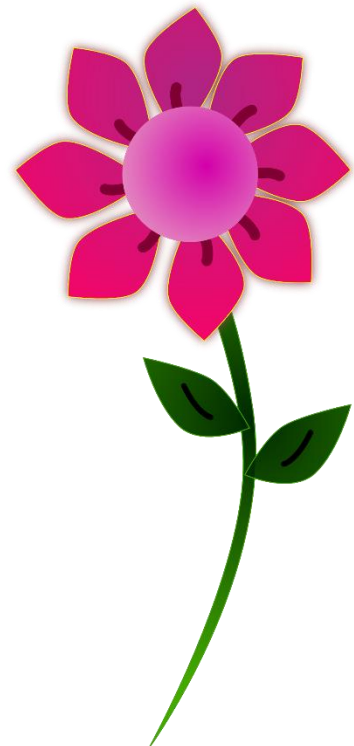

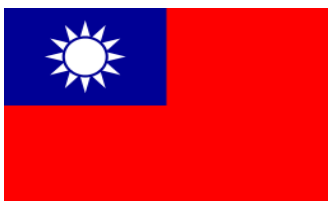

International Exchanges:

- (2018 *Outbound*) 8/19 – 9/7 - To Tamworth, Brisbane, and Bundaberg, Australia. Judie has been in contact with their clubs. They recommended going first to Tamworth, then Bundaberg, arriving in Bundaberg for one week. The Ambassadors going to Australia have been fluid, with some members having to cancel and other new members signing up. We are now at 14 and can accommodate 16.
- (2018 *Inbound*) 10/1-8 - We will host the Hsinchu Taiwan club. Smith Holt will be the host coordinator with Linda Weber assisting.
- (2019 *Outbound*) Sao Paulo & Florianopolis Brazil – probably August. (The Sao Paulo group is reciprocal)
- (2019 *Inbound*) We were looking to get a European club, but there are no clubs from Europe requesting to come to Colorado Springs, so we will concentrate on domestic inbounds.
- (2020 *Outbound*) Looking to make a journey somewhere in Europe.

Domestic Exchanges:

- (2018 *Outbound*) – Dan reported that there has been communication between Judie and Rod Baker in Orlando for a possible Nov 2018 outbound exchange – it is still up in the air.

- (2018 *Inbound*) July 18-24 – San Antonio/Tucson. Susan Tindell will be the host coordinator with Marilyn Werschky assisting.

**Introductory Remarks (Dan Hannaway):**

- FFI World Conference will be held in Boulder CO. Dan will be attending. A ‘go-to’ (teleconference) will be held in May to discuss topics and to provide input.



- Report on Presidents' Conference, held April 28<sup>th</sup> in Loveland: The database at FFI has been hacked. One FF club invited international students to make presentation at their general meeting - the possibility of our club doing the same was discussed.
- Western Region Super Conference will be held May 3-5 in Sacramento CA. Dan will be attending.
- Website progress – nothing new.
- The Bylaws were approved on April 17th by membership. FFI slightly reworded our Mission Statement.
- It's time to start thinking about the election of new council members in October 2019. Of the 7 current council members, 4 are coming up on term limits – Dan Hannaway, Dick Battersby, Judie Werschky, and Jerry Sabolik. We will need a minimum of 4 new council members.
- We should consider making a substantial cash gift to Silver Key in December. Their facility is such a nice venue and the charge to us so minimal.

- The Minutes of the council meeting on February 6th, were read. A motion was made to approve by Mort and seconded by Jerry.

#### **Treasurer (Dick Battersby):**

- The Treasurer's Report (5/1/2018) was disseminated. It was reviewed and a motion was made to accept it and was seconded.
